Category #	Category Name & Description - ARTS
70	Painting - Oil
71	Painting - Acrylic
72	Painting - Pastel
73	Painting - Watercolor
74	Drawing - Charcoal, Colored Pencil, Black & White, etc.
75	Mixed Media/Collage - A combination of any two or more of the first four divisions, and/or FLAT materials to form a framed picture.
80	Miniatures - Any medium of the first four divisions, being no larger than 4 x 6, including frame.
90	Photography - Our World Up Close - Create a visual that offers a novel viewpoint or a macro image that takes the viewer into a whole new, tiny world. Macro photography creates photos of small items that are larger than life. Some common examples are bugs or parts of flowers.
91	Photography - Natural Wonders - Use wide angles and panoramas, or changeable landscape images, to showcase mountains, meadows, sandhills, rivers, waterfalls, oceans, deserts, or any other magnificent vista.
92	Photography - Reflections - Feature a setting, situation, or landmark that brings back poignant memories, or capture a fleeting image reflected in glass, water, or another mirrored surface.
93	Photography - Living the Volunteer Spirit - These photographs capture the special moments in the lives of GFWC clubwomen as they meet, plan, advocate, volunteer, or celebrate, in groups or one-on-one.
